### ULTIMATE UPGRADE

Last year, 73 million U.S. tourists traveled abroad, a record number, federal data show. Europe and the Caribbean remain popular destinations, but there was a notable uptick in the number of Americans traveling to Asia and Oceania in the South Pacific, compared with a year earlier. But what if you want to hit more than one continent in a single trip? For those who can afford to spend six figures per person, there are companies that specialize in group tours that crisscross the globe via private jet. They also throw in gourmet meals, pit stops at luxury hotels and spas, and in-flight lectures from experts. Just reading the tour descriptions is its own form of escape. Here are some itineraries to contemplate while you're riding the Metro. — ANNYS SHIN



### **SEA. SKY. SAFARI.**

This trip, offered by TCS World Travel, a 26-year-old company that specializes in private-jet tours, starts on a SeaDream Yacht Club vessel before switching to aircraft. Fifty-two guests will stop at Mediterranean ports, then fly to Africa. It sets sail May 5 and returns May 24. Cost: \$107,000 per person for double occupancy.
